Attendance

A significant proportion of our students have an attendance rate of around 90%. Many believe this to be acceptable, but what does it really mean for our students?

A student with a 90% attendance record is absent from lessons for the equivalent of one half-day every week.

A student with a 90% attendance rate misses the equivalent of four whole weeks of lessons in one school year.

A child who misses school just twice per month will lose out on 18 days' education across the school year – that's nearly four weeks.

Just a reminder, when reporting your child's absence from school please ensure you leave a detailed reason for their absence. Thank you.




Our current school attendance is 94.18%
